

National Chung Hsing University Bachelor's Degree Requirements Regulations

Enacted in the 89th Academic Affairs Meeting on Apr. 21st, 2025

Article 1 These regulations are established in accordance with Article 3, Paragraph 3 of the National Chung Hsing University Bachelor's Program Regulations (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations") to assist undergraduate students of National Chung Hsing University in their adaptive development and integrate diverse, cross-disciplinary learning opportunities to cultivate creative interdisciplinary talents.

Article 2 The application period, deadline, and the approved number of students allowed to pursue the university's bachelor's degree shall be handled in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations.

Each student is limited to being approved for one university bachelor's degree.

Article 3 Undergraduate students applying to pursue the University's Bachelor's Degree (hereinafter referred to as "students") shall submit a study plan after completing the courses required under Article 3, Paragraph 1 of the Regulations. The plan shall be discussed with the Cross-Disciplinary Learning Planning Office and then submitted to the General Education Center for review by the review committee. The application review results shall be communicated to the applicant and the student's department, with a copy forwarded to the Registration Division.

The format of the study plan and related review procedures shall be separately prescribed by the General Education Center.

Article 4 Students shall plan to complete at least four domain modules or undergraduate cross-disciplinary credit programs offered by the University, and these must span more than one college. The total number of credits earned shall not be fewer than 48.

If a course taken as part of the aforementioned domain modules or undergraduate cross-disciplinary credit programs has the same course title as a compulsory course in the student's home department, or if courses with the same title appear across the selected modules or programs, the student shall take additional courses offered within the respective modules or programs to fulfill the credit requirements. Such substitutions must be approved by the convener of the offering academic unit, and a signed approval form shall be submitted to the General Education Center for recordkeeping.

The domain modules and undergraduate cross-disciplinary credit programs referred to in the preceding two paragraphs shall be implemented in accordance with the University's "Modular Program Implementation Regulations" and "NCHU Cross-Disciplinary Credit Program and Micro-credit Programs Implementation Regulations."

Article 5 If students need to make any of the following changes during their study of the University's bachelor's degree, they must submit an application to the General Education Center. Changes may only be made upon approval after review:

- I. Domain modules or undergraduate cross-disciplinary credit programs.
- II. University bachelor's degree title or domain theme title.

Article 6 Students pursuing the University Bachelor's Degree who meet their department's eligibility to graduate but do not meet the University Bachelor's Degree graduation requirements may apply to the General Education Center to waive the University Bachelor's Degree and graduate with their department's qualifications.

Students pursuing the University Bachelor's Degree who meet the University Bachelor's Degree graduation requirements but do not meet their department's eligibility to graduate may apply to the Registration Division to waive their department's qualification and graduate with the University Bachelor's Degree qualification.

Students graduating with the University Bachelor's Degree qualification shall meet the following graduation requirements:

- I. Total graduation credits: no less than 128 credits.
- II. Completion of University compulsory courses and General Education courses as prescribed by their original department.
- III. III. Completion of at least four reviewed and approved domain modules or undergraduate cross-disciplinary credit programs that span more than one college, with a total of no fewer than 48 credits.
- IV. Elective courses.

Students applying to waive the University Bachelor's Degree shall follow "The NCHU Regulations on Students Pursuing Double Major Studies."

Once approved to waive the University Bachelor's Degree, students may not request to reinstate the waived qualification.

Article 7 Students shall not use waiving the University Bachelor's Degree qualification as a reason to request add/course removal or course withdrawal after the respective deadlines.

After waiving the University Bachelor's Degree qualification, whether the credits earned from University Bachelor's Degree courses passed will be counted towards their department graduation credits shall be determined by their department.

Article 8 The academic transcript and relevant documentary proof of students who have completed the University Bachelor's Degree shall indicate the degree title and the corresponding domain theme. However, those who have waived the qualification or withdrawn from the University shall not have such annotations.

Article 9 These Regulations and any amendments hereto shall be approved in Academic Affairs Meetings before taking effect.
