NCHU Regulations for the Center for General Education **Curriculum Committee**

Enacted in the General Education Committee on Jun. 4th, 2018 Amended (Article 8) in the General Education Execution Committee on Dec. 19th, 2018

- Article 1 NCHU Center for General Education of the Office of Academic Affairs (hereinafter referred to as Center) has established the Regulations in compliance with NCHU Organizational Rules for Curriculum Committees.
- Article 2 The Center has established the Curriculum Committee (hereinafter referred to as Committee) to plan and deliberate on general education courses.
- Article 3 The Committee shall consist of 9 to 11 members, including ex-officio members, appointed members, a one student representative.
 - I . Ex-officio member: Chief Director of the Center.
 - II. Appointed members: Related experts or scholars recommended and appointed by the Chief Director and President, respectively.
 - III. Student representative: Recommended by the NCHU Student Government.

The Chief Director of the Center shall invite industry experts or alumni to participate in curriculum discussions if necessary.

Relevant persons may be invited to attend meetings.

Article 4 The term for the ex-officio member is the term for the office of the Chief Director.

> The terms for appointed members and student representatives are both one year each, with the possibility of one additional, consecutive term.

> If an appointed member or student representative's seat falls vacant before the end of the term, the term already served by the original member will be calculated into the term of his/her successor.

- Article 5 The Committee shall, in principle, convene at least once every academic year. The meeting will be convened and chaired by the Chief Director of the Center. When the Chief Director is unable to attend the meeting for certain reasons, the Committee shall elect one of the members to chair the Committee.
- Article 6 The Committee shall only begin if at least half of the committee members are present. The resolution requires assent from more than half of all attending members.
- Article 7 For any matters not mentioned herein, please refer to related NCHU regulations.
