

# NCHU Guidelines for Master's Degree Part-time and Full-time Students Cross Course Selection

- Article 1 These regulations are adopted for master's degree part-time and full-time students who would like to cross-select non-compulsory courses.
- Article 2 Master's degree part-time and full-time students who are qualified, based upon one of the below conditions, may cross-select non-compulsory courses:
1. The selected courses are not available in their own discipline.
  2. Students have studied for more than two years and have a class schedule conflict with re-taken courses, make-up courses, or major courses that may affect their graduation requirements.
  3. Other special conditions approved by the Dean of Academic Affairs.
- Article 3 Students who are cross-selecting courses must fill-out an application form, have it approved by course professors, both faculty chairs, and the Admissions Principle.
- Article 4 The waiving of cross-selection course credit limits is set by each faculty member themselves, and the limit is not allowed to be over half of the total graduate course credits (excluding thesis credit) [for students in master's program who take courses in in-service master's program](#).
- Article 5 Master's degree part-time student tuition payment is set according to NCHU Guidelines for Student Tuition Payments.
- Article 6 These guidelines are to be implemented after being passed at the Admission Affairs Meeting, and the same applies in the case of other amendments.
