

學生學習社群計畫

一、計畫目的:國立中與大學教學資源暨發展中心(下稱「本中心」)為提升高教公共性,發揮教育 促進社會階級流動正向功能,落實教育機會均等理念,鼓勵學生組成學習社群, 以跨領域學習、多元探索、專業領域學習為主題,發展獨特、具創意的學習模式, 並藉由同儕小組互動討論,培養批判思考、團隊合作與跨領域解決問題能力,提 升本校學生學習視野與參與跨域自主學習風氣,訂定本計畫。

二、實施對象:具本校學籍之在學生

三、實施期間:核定後至114年12月26日止

四、實施方式:

(一)學習社群每組成員至少五人,至多十人。每組應自行推舉一位召集人為聯繫窗口,負責協助處理組務。

每位學生每學期至多擔任一組學習社群召集人。

- (二)學習社群之主題:
 - 1. 自訂學習主題:自訂欲探討之主題,發展專業科目以外之多元、跨領域學習。
 - 2. 專業學科之進階學習:以提升專業科目之學習為主。
- (三)計書優先補助含跨系成員或以跨領域學習為主題之社群,以鼓勵學生跨領域學習。
- (四)學習社群之聚會討論,每期不得少於6次,每次時間至少1小時。若一日多次聚會僅採計一次;每次聚會應三分之二以上成員出席。
- (五)社群實施期間,須至少申請一次「學習規劃諮詢服務」,由成員提出社群運作中遇到 之問題與需求,作為後續執行調整參考。
- (六)凡計畫申請經審核通過,每組基本補助金額為 8,000 元:
 - 1. 材料費:影印、文具、材料等相關費用,用途明細須與執行學習社群相關,憑據實報實銷。
 - 2. 誤餐費:每次 100 元/人(當次討論時間須為午餐或晚餐時段),補助金額以基本補助額 8,000 元之 30% 為上限,即至多 2,400 元。
 - 3. 額外材料費補助:若社群成員中有符合本校「提升高教公共性就學協助獎勵辦法」 第二條規定之對象,得申請額外材料費補助,金額至多 2,000 元。總補助金額上限 為 10,000 元,此項額外補助不得挪作誤餐費使用。
- (七)以下情形將終止(追回)學生學習社群補助:
 - 1. 實際聚會討論次數少於6次者,終止補助。
 - 2. 未於規定時間內繳交活動紀錄表、成果分享影片者,或未出席本中心辦理之成果發 表會者,追回補助。

五、成果發表:

- (一)受補助之學習社群須於規定時間內繳交活動紀錄表、成果分享影片,並出席本中心辦理之成果發表會。成果分享影片片長3分鐘至10分鐘,格式1080P,內容應包含:(1)主題介紹(2)歷程記錄(3)所有成員心得與反思。
- (二) 凡完整執行計畫之學習社群,每位成員得申請證書一紙。
- (三)本中心得舉辦學習社群成果競賽,表現優秀者於成果發表會頒發獎狀或其他獎勵表揚。 評鑑項目:(1)計畫申請書 20% (2)討論紀錄表 40% (3)成果分享影片 40%。

六、注意事項:

- (一) 請勿使用學習社群成員當學期修課之作業或報告主題申請本學習社群。
- (二)本計畫每學期補助額度及案數視各年度預算與申請狀況而定,當年度經費用罄時,不再受理申請及補助。
- 七、申請方式:有意申請者,請以小組為單位,由召集人於114年10月6日前至「<u>教發中心教學</u> <u>計畫申請系統</u>—學生學習社群計畫」提出申請。審查結果將公告於本中心網頁,並以 email 通 知召集人。

Student Learning Community Project

Project Objectives:

The Development of Teaching and Learning Center (hereinafter referred to as "the Center") at National Chung Hsing University aims to strengthen the public role of higher education, foster social mobility through education, and uphold the principle of equal educational opportunities. To achieve this, the Center encourages students to form learning communities focused on interdisciplinary learning, diverse exploration, and professional field studies. These communities are expected to develop unique and creative learning models through peer group discussions, cultivating critical thinking, teamwork, and problem-solving skills across disciplines. This project aims to broaden students' learning horizons and foster a culture of autonomous, cross-disciplinary learning at the university.

Target Participants:

Students currently enrolled at National Chung Hsing University.

Implementation Period:

From the approval date to **December 26, 2025**.

Implementation Method:

1. Formation of Learning Communities:

- Each learning community must consist of 5 to 10 members. Each group should elect one member to serve as the convener, who will act as the primary contact and help coordinate group activities.
- o Each student may serve as the convener for only one learning community per semester.

2. Themes of Learning Communities:

- Self-defined Learning Themes: Topics chosen by the group for exploring beyond their major fields of study.
- Advanced Professional Subject Learning: Focused on enhancing learning within their professional fields.

3. Funding Priority:

 Communities that include members from different departments or focus on interdisciplinary learning themes will receive priority for funding to encourage crossdisciplinary learning.

4. Meeting Frequency:

Each learning community must hold at least six meetings per semester, with each meeting lasting no less than one hour and attended by at least two-thirds of the members. Multiple meetings held on the same day shall be counted as a single meeting.

5. Academic Advising Consultation:

 During the semester, each community must attend at least one session of the Academic Advising Consultation. This consultation allows members to raise challenges or needs encountered during implementation, which will serve as a reference for future adjustments.

6. Funding:

Each approved project is eligible for a base subsidy of NT\$8,000 per group, which may be used for the following:

- Material Costs: Expenses such as photocopying, stationery, or other materials directly related to community activities. Reimbursements are based on actual expenses with receipts.
- Meal Allowance: NT\$100 per person per meeting, but only if the meeting is during lunch or dinner time. Meal subsidies are capped at 30% of the NT\$8,000 base subsidy (i.e., up to NT\$2,400).
- o Additional Material Subsidy: If the group includes members who meet the eligibility criteria in Article 2 of the university's "Incentive Measures for Increasing Disadvantaged Student Assistance in Higher Education (提升高教公共性就學協助獎勵辦法)," the group may apply for an additional subsidy of up to NT\$2,000 for material costs. The maximum cumulative subsidy per group is NT\$10,000, and the additional subsidy may only be used for material costs, not for meals.

7. Termination of Funding:

- o Funding shall be terminated if the actual number of meetings is fewer than six.
- Failure to submit the required deliverables, including activity records, result-sharing videos, or to attend the results presentation organized by the Center will result in termination of funding and recovery of disbursed funds.

Results Presentation:

1. Submission of Deliverables:

• Funded learning communities must submit activity records and result-sharing videos within the specified time and attend the results presentation held by the Center. The result-sharing video should be 3 to 10 minutes in length, in 1080p format, and include: (1) Theme Introduction, (2) Process Records, and (3) Reflections from all members.

2. Certificates:

o Upon full completion of the project, each member may apply for a certificate.

3. Competitions and Awards:

- The Center may organize a competition for learning community results, with outstanding performances recognized with awards or other commendations at the results presentation.
- Evaluation criteria: (1) Project Proposal: 20%, (2) Discussion Records: 40%, (3) Result-sharing Video: 40%.

Important Notes:

- 1. Do not apply for this learning community project using topics or assignments from courses taken in the current semester.
- 2. The amount of funding and the number of grants available each semester shall be subject to the annual budget and the number of applications. No further applications or funding shall be accepted once the annual budget is exhausted.

Application Procedure:

Interested applicants shall apply as a group, with the convener submitting the application through the "Teaching Plan Application System – Student Learning Community Project" of the Development of Teaching and Learning Center, no later than October 6, 2025. The review results will be announced on the Center's website and notified via email to the convener.
