- 1. The quota and monthly stipend for Teaching Assistant scholarships for university-level General Education courses are allocated based on decisions made by the "The University and College level Curriculum Labor-based Teaching Assistant Review Committee" for the current semester.

The allocated quota of teaching assistants shall be based on the number of enrolled students after the add-drop period, with a principle of assigning one TA for every 50 students enrolled or more. College Chinese, activity-oriented, Information Literacy, and Cross-fields practicum courses are exempt from the above restriction.
